In November of 2014, Governor Rick Scott appointed Judge Cox to the Circuit Court. She has served in the Criminal division and currently serves in the Family and Dependency Divisions in Clay County. Judge Cox was also appointed by Governor Jeb Bush in 2005 as a County Court Judge. For 9 years, Judge Cox served as a County Court Judge, where she presided over criminal, civil, small claims, and traffic court cases. Before becoming a judge, she served as an Assistant State Attorney in the Fourth Judicial Circuit of Florida. During her tenure in the State Attorney's Office where she was awarded the Outstanding Young Prosecutor Award, she was a part of the Homicide Team, Special Assault Division, and the Repeat Offender Court. She completed her Prosecutorial career as a Division Chief in County Court.

Judge Cox serves as Associate Dean and Faculty of the Florida Judicial College which is tasked with educating and training all of Florida's newly elected and appointed Judges. She has also served on the Faculty of the National Judicial College and the Prosecutor/Public Defender Training Program at the University of Florida College of Law. Judge Cox attended Tennessee State University where she received her B.S. in Criminal Justice in 1995. She received her J.D. Degree from the University of Memphis School of Law in 1998.
