CONSENT ORDER

THIS CAUSE having come on agreement of the Parties and the Court being fully advised in the premises hereby:

FIND AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Court has jurisdiction of the Parties and the subject matter of this action.
2. There is a pending dissolution of marriage proceeding.
3. Husband issued a cashier's check for \$44, 522.06 from the joint personal Wells Fargo account which was recovered by Wells Fargo. The \$44,522.06 is now in a temporary suspense account with Wells Fargo. The Parties agree to place the \$44,522.06, currently in the temporary suspense account, into the Registry of the Court.
4. The Parties own a marital home located at 4071 Eagle Landing Parkway, Orange Park, Florida 32065. The Husband has moved out of the marital home. The Parties agree that the

Wife should have temporary exclusive use and possession of the home until further Order of the Court.

5. The Parties have disclosed information in the course of this family law case, including information and documents required by Rule 12.285 of the Florida Family Rules of Procedure and in other various motions. Disclosure of this information would cause substantial injury to the Parties as provided by Rule 12.400(c) of Florida Family Law Rules of Procedure and is, therefore, confidential under Rule 2.420(c)(9) of the Florida Rules of Judicial Administration. The Parties own several businesses and desire to preserve the good will of the businesses.

6. The degree, duration, and manner of the requested confidentiality of the Dissolution of Proceeding action is no broader than necessary to protect the Parties' interests set forth in Paragraph 5 above.

7. No less restrictive measures are available to protect the interests set forth in Paragraph 5 above.

8.. Both Parties agree to confidentiality of court records to protect the good will of the businesses.

9. The Parties have reached an agreement. It is therefore

ORDERED:

A. Wells Fargo is hereby directed to deposit the approximately \$44,522.06 held in a temporary suspense account into the Registry of the Court.

B. The Wife shall have temporary exclusive use and possession of the marital home located at 4071 Eagle Landing Parkway, Orange Park, Florida 32065.

C. The Clerk of the Court is hereby directed to seal the file and otherwise prevent the dissemination to the public of the information in family law proceeding.

1. Except for those persons named in any subsequent Order and under the

conditions set forth in any such Order, the following are the only persons to have access to and allowed inspection of this file:

- (a) The Parties herein and the attorneys of record for the Parties;
- (b) The Clerk of the Circuit Court and employees thereof in fulfillment of their duties;
- (c) Any person who establishes that disclosure of the information is necessary for government or judicial accountability or has a proper first amendment right to the information.

2. The Parties and counsel are admonished that they are ordered, likewise, not to disclose or divulge any such information to any individual other than those set forth herein.

3. The Clerk of the Court is hereby directed to publish this Order in accordance with Rule of Judicial Administration 2.420(d)(4).

4. The Husband will cause the return the Parties' dog, Lyle, on February 27, 2020.

5. The Wife shall cause to be delivered Husband's pay checks for February 13, 2020 and February 27, 2020 on February 27, 2020.

6. The Wife shall resume Husband's regular pay beginning February 27, 2020 from the Oakleaf Family Chiropractic, Inc. and Bartram Family Chiropractic, Inc. until further Order of the Court. Wife will mail Husband's pay checks in a timely manner to Patricia L. Parker, Esquire, 8833 Perimeter Park Blvd., Suite 1003, Jacksonville, FL 32216.
